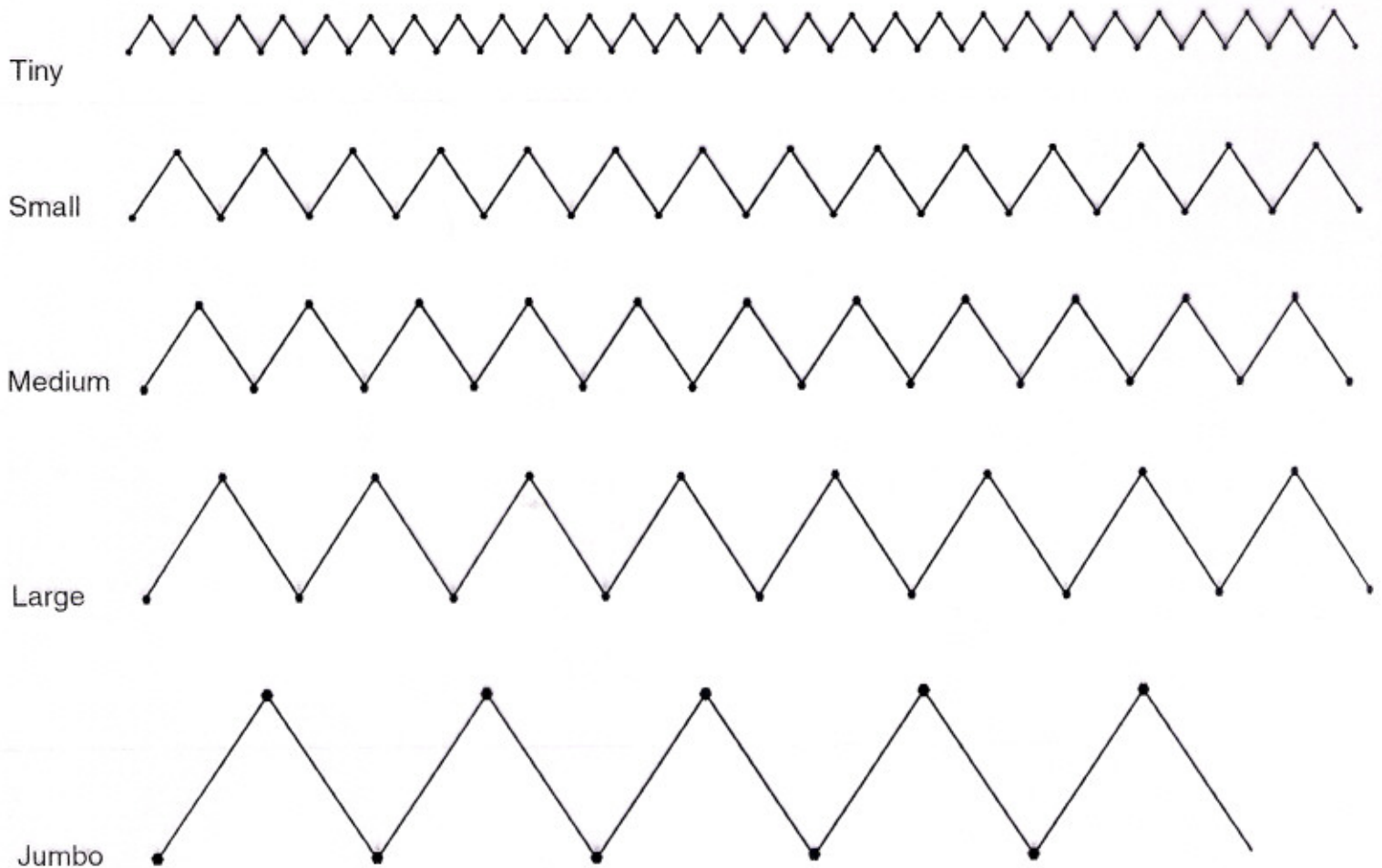


Zig Zag Template (GS-34)



Directions:

1. Print at 100% onto 8 1/2 x 11 sheet of plastic template material (Or on paper, and photo copy onto plastic)
2. Cut into strips so that stitch sizes are separate (tiny, small, medium, large, jumbo)
3. Use a hole punch to make holes where the tiny dots are at the top and bottom of the stitch points. This will be your guide to stitch. Make sure the hole you are punching is tiny enough to allow a pencil lead to enter, but no larger.
4. Place a stitch template on your crazy patch project and align the basic stitch at a pleasing location (center the seam, top of seam, bottom of seam, etc)
5. Place the tip of a lead pencil (or other marking tool of your choice) in the template holes to mark your stitch placement. (I find the pencil marks best by pushing down and twisting...instead of "writing".
6. Using the pencil marks, stitch the basic zig zag. Embellish with other combination stitches.
